

GUIDELINES FOR MUSICAL ACCOMPANIMENT FOR WEDDINGS AT ST PATRICK'S AND ST ADALBERT'S

If your wedding ceremony includes Mass and Holy Communion, there is a place for four musical pieces during the ceremony:

- 1. The Wedding Processional – the Entrance**
- 2. A song between the Scripture readings**
- 3. At the reception of Holy Communion**
- 4. The Wedding Recessional as you leave the church**

If you are not having Holy Communion, then eliminate #3 above.

There will be no music before the Wedding Processional – no background music, no separate musical pieces to accompany the groom's parents or the bride's mother.
